Overview

The Department of Clinical Nutrition at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia announces a multidisciplinary program providing strategies to nourish the pediatric patient in a variety of situations, from failure to thrive through post-bariatric surgery. The course is directed toward dietitians, family physicians, pediatricians, nurse practitioners and allied health professionals.

Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- Describe the variety of disturbances in eating that occur from childhood through adolescence
- Recognize the behaviors commonly seen in feeding aversions
- Describe normal growth and the deviations from normal growth standards in children who fail to thrive
- Review treatment options from traditional weight management to bariatric surgery in obese adolescents
